#### 7:05 pm: Crime/Traffic report from Captain Dennis Andreas

- School zone cameras are now issuing tickets
  - o In front of GW middle school north and south bound
    - Enforcement during pick up and drop off (school zone speed limit)
  - Francis Hammond
  - Ferdinand Day
- Crime:
  - Larcenies: 12 in Del Ray shoplifting, not much pattern visible
    - Seeing it all over the City, primary driver of crime rate
  - 3 burglaries
    - Construction site
    - Residential known party
    - Restaurant on Mt. Vernon known party
  - Felonious assault
    - Arrest was made
- DRCA / DRBA reached out to ACPD to have some conversations about what residents and businesses can do to deter increasing nuisance crime
  - Significant uptick in disruptive crime kids middle school age most likely, causing trouble at residential properties (night time disturbances), several neighborhood events, screaming obscenities, throwing trash
  - Teenagers don't want to send them down a bad path but what are ways to intervene
  - Community policing philosophy
  - New communications person at police department
  - Dashboard to come out Monday show more about crime rates
  - Focus group to address this problem, possibly use Del Ray as a pilot program

- Comment from Jim Snyder: There is excessive traffic and speeding on Commonwealth Avenue. This is very concerning since this is a very active pedestrian path way to Mount Vernon School. Windsor Avenue is particularly bad since there is no 4 way stop but a major pedestrian crossing with no stop sign. Lots of accidents bad accident or tragedy waiting to happen.
- Capt. Andreas: Send in traffic concerns through Alex311 to get both T&ES and police department to look at it
  - Jim S: It was supposed to be a 4-way stop as part of the traffic calming years ago but never got put in
  - Jim S: New state law about requiring stopping at every pedestrian crosswalk, we were in a car accident at this location, many pedestrians
  - Katie Waynick: Please send an email to the exec board
  - o Jim S: Arlington Ridge road has speed limit signs that post speed
  - Bryan Hayes, T&ES: Received a 311 comment on this place recently trees are on private property, Dept. of right of way people will work with homeowners to resolve the tree blocking the stop sign. Also sent to traffic engineers to asses the intersection for



- appropriate improvements or interventions. Complete streets and vision zero looks at corridors that speeding is a problem, so we can look at this street. Community feedback is very important, even if it is slow, please submit the 311 tickets.
- Jim S: Please come talk to some of the neighbors on site with the people who are living adjacent to the intersection.
- Elena Hutchison: The DRCA used to have a Traffic Calming committee and we would love to bring that back, but we need volunteers who feel passionate about it
- Gayle Reuter: Please get word out to cyclists that they also have to obey the traffic rules so one of us don't hit them.
- Rod Kuckro: Solicitors coming selling candy with a story about their lives. Does Alexandria require people to have a permit to do this? Arlington and Fairfax County require this.
  - o Capt. A: Pedlar's license through City Hall should be available for review or inspection
  - Rod: Young people in a van that are collecting money for someone else can't tell if it is a scam or not

- Community Academy graduation just occurred, follow up with Spring Semester if you are interested



- Complete Streets coordinator works with Alex Carol who oversees the program: How can we use the City's infrastructure to encourage slower safer driving.
- Vision Zero goal of 0 crashes by 2028
- Safe routes to school: 20th anniversary this year promotes walking and biking through infrastructure improvements
  - alexandriava.gov/go/2685
  - Received a grant to install traffic gardens
- Walk Audits: <u>alexandriava.gov/go/4203</u>
  - City collaborates with school, families, advocacy groups and police to document drop off or pick up - being on the ground to observe the reality
  - o 2017
    - reviewed 13 elementary schools, more than 60% of recommendations are completed or in progress.

  - o 2023
    - 2 Middle schools, 2 high school campuses and 1 elementary schools
    - George washington Middle school observed drop off




- Curb Extensions Near schools: <u>alexandriava.gov/go/4745</u>
  - Identify sidewalk curb extensions to prioritize funding
  - Extend the curb into the street so that pedestrians have a shorter distance to cross the street. Instead of 20', 12-15'
  - Slows down drivers narrower road makes us want to be more cautious
  - Slow down turns because they are sharper
  - More green space, more pedestrian waiting space
  - Proposed on Commonwealth near Mount Vernon Community school
    - "Z" crossing
    - Sent a grant applicant to VDOT for 3 intersections near MVCS - will know next year if we get the grant
    - Would be late 2025 and construction 2026 if this is funded
    - There will continue to be more community involvement before the intersections are fully designed - still need to look at stormwater



### • Spot Improvements

- East Uhler Ave
  - Crash involving a pedestrian (parent / teacher) hit by a car
  - Traffic and Parking board approved removal of parking spaces at intersection of Uhler and Clyde to create more visibility
  - Repaving will occur this year and new crosswalk and painted curb extension will be added
- Contra-Flow Bike Lane
  - East Glendale Ave is a one way street at this location, allowing eastbound bike lane
  - From Mt. Vernon ave to Potomac Yard
  - Westbound cyclists use travel lane





### • Speed camera safety program

- Virginia passed law authorizing cameras in 2020
- Question: Can speed limit around schools be reduced to 20 mph
- What tools are at our disposal as an association for traffic calming:
  - O Speed humps / speed tables option for side streets, requires upfront community input
  - Requesting stop signs
  - Speed feedback signs
  - Rectangular rapid flash beacons

- City Staff estimates number of students generated
- Adding additional capacity in new schools as they are modernized and renovated
- Question Teacher retention: Compensation and benefits package. Steps that were frozen, when will those get back - teachers that came in after the freeze are getting equivalent to teachers that have been working longer.
  - Answer: Rene Paschal: Washington area board's annual survey comes out soon and it should show that our salaries are competitive and ACPS offers benefits packages that can't be matched by other NoVA districts.
- Question: Please address out of boundary students.
  - Answer: Michelle Rief: Try to limit reasons for why students would transfer. Most were driven by capacity issues - if a school is full sometimes students are transferred. Dual language schools are attractive - MVCS and John Adams. Look at expanding dual language to other schools or how do we address Mt. Vernon capacity.
- Question: Please address State Standardized Tests.
  - ACPS has seen small increases, not back to pre-pandemic levels. Continue to focus on improvement. Virginia Literacy Act - focus directed toward reading and literacy, tweaking the way that reading is taught which will probably have a big impact.

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- Question: Have you considered other buildings for school expansion such as 2525 Mt.
   Vernon Ave (Department of Community and Human Services) for an expansion of MVCS:
  - Answer: Michele Rief / Jacinta Green: Joint facilities master plan is a document that was produced looking at all of the buildings owned by the City and School that assessed the quality of the building. This could be a good location for an early childhood center. Let's bring it up to the mayor and see what he has to say about that.
- Question: Expansion of Pre-K programs
  - Answer: Rene Paschal: Had problems filling all of the spaces this past year.
- Question: What are you doing to address the Credited with conditions status of Alexandria City High School and Jefferson Houston K-8?:
  - Answer: State has different criteria that the schools have to meet. Need to give
    additional focus to those schools. Can share additional information with the
    Association via email. Schools are working through a Virginia State system that
    requires an external process that is also replicated within the school district.
