President / Chief Executive Officer Hopkins House Website

- Non-profit organization
- Founded in 1939
- Mr. Hopkins joined the staff in 1991. He is the seventh and longest-serving chief executive of Hopkins House. He has a master's degree from Columbia University in the City of New York. He has over 35 years of senior-level management experience. He is a resident of Fairfax County, Virginia.
- Federal Funding was cut across the Nation because of the impending War
 - Child care services were cut and there was no option left for African American mothers that needed to work
 - 7 teachers created Hopkins house to help women, particularly African American women, work while sending their children
- Hopkins House Dr. Jonathan Milton Hopkins
 - Lifelong Alexandrian
 - Only doctor who provided African Americans in Alexandria with all healthcare including care for pregnant women
 - Teachers started the organization and felt that Dr. Hopkins was worthy of the name
- Started as a nursery, but then became a Settlement House location for people to go to get help when migrating across the country, food, job, help
- 50s and 60s, Hopkins House would provide assistance with medications with local pharmacies, short-term jobs, groceries
- Graduates of Hopkins House
 - Bill Euille
 - Earl Lloyd first African American to play in the NBA
 - Hellen Day teacher
- Many politicians have visited Hopkins House as guests
- 91-94 decided that as a non-profit organization they could no longer afford all of the things they were doing were not able to be continued give back some programs
 - AIDS program
 - Elderly
 - Lunch Bags
- Core functions of Hopkins House
 - Preschool
 - Early Childhood Learning Institute

- Mt. Jefferson Park
 - Started as part of Oakville Triangle Development
 - Commonwealth to rt. 1
 - Developer of Oakville triangle is helping the City to complete part of the Park
 - Most of the park opened last year
 - Dog park still closed due to drainage problems engineering solution has been identified and Stonebridge is working on a construction schedule including landscaping - including grass
- Simpson Dog Park
 - Design process
 - Contractor issues working to get resolved
 - \circ $\;$ Substantial completion of the end of March
 - Plan completed per the plan City comes in and checks for final work to be completed and then can open to the public
 - Met today to discuss some safety issues
 - Hoping to have park open in April
 - Lights have been going up slowly
 - Plumbing work happening
 - Fencing and gates are going in
 - Renovation of full Simpson is far into design process
 - Had to take a tree (by concessions stand) down early because it was suffering structural damages

- Kristine Hesse: Regular user of the Greenway, a lot of dead small trees, brush and a vandalized sign, what is the timeline for the rest of the park being cleaned up? Seems like part of the problem was that the installed plants were not watered.
 - Bethany: Plants from raymond to rt. 1 are part of what the developer planted, those are under warranty. City is doing punch list checks. Landscape review usually occurs in April so things have a chance to leaf out. Full assessment done at this time. Will make a full replacement list for the developer's contractor to replace everything under warranty. Best time to replant is in the spring.
 - Jack: Developer is required to do installation, City does not have much control over establishment period. It is more cost effective for the developer to see what happens and then replace rather than spend a lot of time caring for the plants during the warranty period. Please use 311 to report vandalism or other things that you notice in the Park to help Staff know what needs to be done.
- Bea and Barb: Mount Jefferson Greenway A lot of debris was collected in fall and left them on the side of the trail - can those be picked up? Number of evergreen trees where the tops are alive and the lower branches are dead - some have been trimmed in a way that protrude onto the walkway.
 - Jack: It sounds like I have a park to inspect. Overhanging branches should be cleared to a safe distance. Some invasive removals that were placed on hold because of volunteer projects were organized in advance. Not sure if any of those were involved in this park. Still a mix of who is responsible for what, the City does the work for the trail.
- Carol Black:
 - Trail behind GW middle school Main Line Blvd- some trees have tall suckers and low branches that could hurt a child in a stroller. I have had mixed results with using 311, some of it gets lost in translation. No one from the arborists office has called back.
 - Jack: Include pictures with your 311 submission, urban forestry team will be getting devices they can use in the field
 - New urban forest manager
- Gayle Reuter: Partnership for the spray park was started in 2018, big fundraiser to raise money. Excited to see the spray park open.
- Kristine Hesse:
 - We were instrumental in getting Kettle Park developed see some dead trees over there, can you please put that on your list to check on?
 - A property on East Alexandria that had an SUP request is next to the City Right of way, Parks Department considers that open space. At the City Council meeting last night Mayor Wilson mentioned vacating the property. Maybe the Parks department can purchase the property.
 - Jack: Multiple residents have asked to vacate it, Parks department considers it open space and will be keeping our eye on it.
 - What can DRCA do to help?
 - Beth: process in the City residents can recommend that the City investigate a parcel or right of way to investigate for purchase as open

space. This wouldn't need to be purchased, but could start the process. I can provide additional information.

- Catharine Rice: Is open space the same as a park?
 - Jack: zoned as right of way, calling it a park is a stretch. Not zoned as a park. Could be a pocket park. There is also an alley that runs on the other side of the property.
- Lisa Quandt: Can you discuss the new park located behind the Dominion substation, Nelson Ave and Potomac yard what are the plans for it?
 - Beth: Small triangle of land that used to be owned by Dominsion and is part of their DSUP - dedicated land to the City. Just a grassy open area right now. There was a pocket park process, not currently funded in capital improvement. Design process with the community based on the 2020 plan.
